We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Vicksburg High School. For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given, as is the case with Vicksburg High School.

In an effort to close gaps in student achievement and accelerate achievement, Vicksburg High School is in the process of identifying priority standards in all courses and developing a system of assessments to ensure all students reach proficiency on those standards. We are committed to the school improvement process in order to meet our vision of all students reaching college and career readiness.

Process for assigning pupils to the school:

Students are assigned to Vicksburg High School based on the geographic boundaries of our district.

Status of the School Improvement Plan:

Vicksburg High School is continuously working towards school improvement goals in all core and elective areas. Goals and progress are reviewed annually to drive instruction and decision-making in all content. Vicksburg High School is committed to becoming a high performing professional learning community.

Parent-Teacher Conferences:



Vicksburg High School schedules three parent-teacher conferences per year. Over the past two years, approximately 112 parents attended conferences, representing approximately 15% of our student population.

Notable Achievements:

- Vicksburg High School had 29 students dual enroll at a local college or university over the past two years. This number represents approximately 10% of all students eligible to dual enroll.
- Vicksburg High School currently offers 18 Advanced Placement courses. Students can earn college credit based on AP exam results. In addition, Vicksburg High School offers additional AP courses online through Michigan Virtual University. Last school year VHS students passed 154 AP exams (scored at 3 or higher).
- Over 350 students have enrolled in Advanced Placement courses over the past two school years totaling 1066 enrollments in AP courses. This number represents approximately 40% of all Vicksburg High School students eligible to take AP courses.
- Over the past two school years, Vicksburg High School students have completed 84 dual enrollment courses making them eligible to receive college credit. Over 90% of all Vicksburg High School students who dual enroll earn or are eligible to receive college credit.
